About the University:

The Auniati University is a private university founded in 2023 under the Assam Private University Act No. XXXIX of 2022 and recognised by University Grants Commission under section 2f of UGC Act, 1956. Established under the aegis of Sri Sri Auniati Satra, Majuli in Assam, the largest Vaishnavite monastery of the State, which came into being consequent to the Bhakti movement led by Mahapurush Sri Sri Sankaradeva, Damodardeva, Harideva, Madhabdeva and other bhakti saints of Assam in the early 16th century, the University stands for Indian value systems and ethos. Inspired by the Satriya culture, based on traditional Indian ideals, Auniati University is committed to offering state-of-the-art education in the 64 kalas including science, medicine, and technology, and creating a research environment relevant to the social, cultural, and moral needs of the society. The University is established by the ‘Auniati Socio-cultural and Educational Development Trust’ under Sri Sri Auniati Satra, with its headquarters in Majuli, Assam.

Campus:

The beautiful green campus of the University is located at Kaliapani village, within the greater campus of the Auniati Sakha Satra (a branch of the main Satra at Majuli, Assam) a place about 3 km east of Teok town and about 30 km from Jorhat town along the National Highway 37. The Master Plan of the University concerns a land area of 63 Bighas of highland belonging to the Sri Sri Auniati Satra. Infrastructure development is in progress.

SPECIAL FEATURES OF THE CBCS SYSTEM:

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is a flexible system of learning allowing students to prefer choices from more than one options and pursue such branches of learning. It thus opens the following options to the learners-

- (a) To choose subjects of their choices from a large pool of subjects offered by the University
- (b) Study additional courses and earn more credits than the requirements needed for a Degree
- (c) Allows learners to widen their knowledge and make the horizon of their knowledge based on interdisciplinary studies
- (d) make the best use of all available expertise in a faculty as well as its infrastructure facilities

ADMISSION SYSTEMS:

A. Admission into Post Graduate Degree Programmes

(See University Regulations for Post Graduate Academic Programmes, Clause-6.00)

Eligibility: Terms and Conditions-

- (a) A student who has passed the three year Undergraduate Courses from a recognized University/Institution of the State/ or any other State of India or any University recognized as such by the Auniati University from abroad, in any stream shall be eligible for admission to the two year PG Courses of the Auniati University under the Pre-NEP 2020 system. Eligible candidates must seek admission within five years of passing the qualifying examinations.

In the normal cases the **minimum qualification** for admission into various Programmes under the CBCS shall be fixed by the Academic Council from time to time, which shall be implemented in the procedure of students admission.

- (b) In case of admission to the PG programme in Performing Arts candidates with a four year diploma in the subject/field from a national level recognized institution in the field over and above 10+2 standard pass shall also be allowed.
- (c) The minimum percentage of marks for consideration for the admission shall be 45 percent in the UG level examinations plus marks obtained in a vive-voce/interview held by the Department for that purpose.

Mere application for admission shall not entitle a candidate for being selected for admission unless he/she obtains requisite percentage of marks in qualifying examination including Viva-Voce test, if held, conducted by the University for admission purposes; or any other such test conducted by other Universities/institutions/Boards recognized by the Auniati University.

Admission to any higher/next Semester shall be allowed to all students irrespective of their pass or fail in the current Semester. But, they must have to successfully complete the courses including the backlogs to be promoted to the next Semester and admission to it.

Candidates having 75% attendance but failing to appear in the End-Semester Examination shall also be eligible to seek the admission to the immediate higher Semester provided that they will have to clear the backlog within a year

Admission Procedure:

- (a) **Central Admission Committee:** There shall be a Central Admission Committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor which shall determine the policies for students admission.
- (b) The Registrar of the University shall notify about the admission to different programmes through Newspaper advertisements/University Websites/ any other agencies seeking applications for admission sufficiently before admission

- (c) If the University feels that a screening admission test shall be necessary to select eligible candidates for admission to a programme, it may hold a Selection Test to be called as Auniati University Students Admission Test (AUSAT) of its own or may collaborate with any other University or agency in such a procedure for final selection of students for admission

B. Admission into Post Graduate Diploma Programme

Eligibility: Terms and Conditions-

- (a) A student who has passed the three year Undergraduate Courses from a recognized University/Institution of the State/ or any other State of India or any University recognized as such by the Auniati University from abroad, in any stream shall be eligible for admission to the one year Post Graduate Diploma in Tea Production and Management of the Auniati University. Preference will be given to the Science Graduate.
- (b) The minimum percentage of marks for consideration for the admission shall be 45 percent in the UG level examinations plus marks obtained in a Viva-Voce/interview held by the Department for that purpose.

If the University feels that a screening admission test shall be necessary to select eligible candidates for admission, it may hold a Selection Test of its own for final selection of students for admission

Admission to any higher/next Semester shall be allowed to all students irrespective of their pass or fail in the current Semester. But, they must have to successfully complete the courses including the backlogs to be promoted to the next Semester and admission to it.

Candidates having requisite attendance but failing to appear in the End-Semester Examination shall also be eligible to seek the admission to the immediate higher Semester provided that they will have to clear the backlog within a year

C. Admission of Students for the Ph.D. Programme:

(See Regulations for the Research Council & the Ph.D. degree)

Educational Qualifications:

A candidate seeking admission to the course for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) shall have to

- (a) complete a 1-year/2-semester Master's Degree programme after a 4-year/8-semester Bachelor's degree programme, or
- (b) a 2-year/4-semester Master's Degree programme after a three-year Bachelor's degree programme, or qualifications declared equivalent to the Master's degree by the corresponding statutory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission after a 4-year/8-semester Bachelor's Degree Programme should have a minimum of 75% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade on a point scale wherever the grading system is followed.

Provided further that a relaxation of 5% in the aggregate marks obtained by an applicant, or equivalent relaxation of Grade, may be allowed for those applicants belonging to ST/SC/OBC /EWS/Differently Abled categories, or any other category of applicants as specified by the UGC from time to time.

1. Relaxation and/or Reservation of Seats:

All sorts of reservations of seats shall be provided in the admission of students as per the Assam State Government Rules. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those

2. The Auniati University Research Admission Test (AURAT):

All applicants seeking admission to the Doctoral programme of the University [except foreign students applying for admission as provided for under Appropriate clause -----] must clear the Auniati University Research Admission Test –the AURAT, which may be both written and Viva-voce, or either of them (Due notifications to that effect shall be made by the University in its website on time) conducted by the University Research Council through a Special Selection Committee (SSC) constituted by it for that purpose.

3. Other Terms and Conditions for Admission:

- (a) The candidates who have qualified the CSIR/UGC NET-JRF and/or having research fellowship from the Government (State or Central) or Semi Government funding agencies and having required educational qualifications shall be exempted from appearing the AURAT. However, they will have to apply for the admission and appear in the Viva-Voce examination before admission is effected.
- (b) Not more than 50 percent of the seats shall be allotted to the candidates sponsored by agencies as referred to the above under (a).
- (c) Mere qualification with the CSIR, UGC NET (JRF), or getting sponsorship etc. shall not qualify a candidate for admission unless the University deems it feasible for their admission
- (d) In general, not more than 50% of the seats in each subject/discipline shall be filled up from among the direct applicants who qualify in the AURAT. However, if there are no applicants from among the categories mentioned under (e) above or if the University deems it necessary, it may go to fill up all or more seats from among the direct applicants for admission who qualify in the AURAT.

4. Interdisciplinary Nature of Research:

- (a) The Ph.D. research in the Auniati University shall be of interdisciplinary nature, and there shall be no strict and edge-cutting disciplinary separation in the level of undertaking research by a student
- (b) Admission shall be open to candidates under a stream or faculty of study, such as Faculty/Stream of Humanities and Social Sciences, Faculty or Stream of Natural/Physical Sciences, Faculty or Stream of Commerce and Business Administration, Faculty or Stream of Medical and Health Sciences, Faculty or Stream of Agricultural Sciences, Faculty of Fine Arts and Performing Arts & etc.

- (c) A candidate with a B.E./B.Tech. Degree with a valid JRF-GATE score may also be considered for admission to the Ph.D. programme of the Auniati University.

7. **Nature of the Programme:**

- (a) The Ph.D. programme shall be a regular programme
- (b) A part time system may be allowed if the Academic Council deems it feasible provided that- a “No Objection Certificate” is submitted from the employer of the candidate to that effect clearly mentioning that it has permitted the candidate to pursue studies on a part-time basis; and that it has no objection to his/her attending the regular academic programmes/classes held in the University as long as it becomes necessary. And for that purpose he/she will be relieved from the duty to complete the course-work.

8. **Foreign Students:**

There shall be provision from admission of Foreign Students in the Ph.D research course of the University. A Committee chaired by the Vice Chancellor constituted by him/her with all the Professors and HODs shall finalise the list of such applicants for admission. The following procedure shall be maintained in this regard-

- (a) The applicant should possess valid research/student visa and other relevant documents including a Medical certificate from appropriate authorities for the prescribed duration of the concerned course at the time of admission;
- (b) The antecedents of the candidate should be verified by the forwarding authority/ministry/institution
- (c) The Central Government rules applicable for admission and maintenance of a foreign student in the country pursuing higher education shall be applicable in their case. (*Ref. AU Regulations for Foreign Students*)
- (d) The candidate should have adequate knowledge of English or the language subject in case the course is to be pursued in a language subject
- (e). The degrees and certificates of the candidate’s country or institution or university should be approved by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU)/Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU) as equivalent to the corresponding Indian degrees;
- (f) All foreign students admitted into the programme shall be full-time Ph.D. scholars. Minimum residential requirement for the foreign students is of two years.
- (g) Hostel accommodations to all the foreign students shall be provided as per University rules.

9. **The Course Work:**

- (a) The selected candidates (through conducted tests) for admission to the Ph.D. course and other categories of students considered for such admission shall be notified for admission by the Registrar. Candidates so notified shall submit their respective admission applications (in Standard Forms supplied by the University through its website) to the HOD of a particular Department in which he/she desires to be enrolled.
- (b) All admitted students shall undergo a full Semester Course work designed by the Department/Faculty which shall include-(i) Literature Study, (ii) Research Methodology, (iii) and Two Courses Papers on the subject of research. The Syllabus for that purpose shall be prepared by the Department/Faculty and approved by the Research Council; and shall be effective after it has been adopted by the Academic Council.
- (c) The Course work shall include both theory classes and Internal assessment (as also Practical classes where necessary) in the proportion of 60:40 in both allotment of Marks and distribution of contents. A minimum of 45% Marks in each of the categories shall be the qualifying Marks for a student.
- (d) A student may be allowed to attend special classes on his/her course work in other than the parent University Department/s, if such a provision is deemed necessary by the Department/Faculty in which the student is pursuing research.

Provided that, in such cases the attended institution/Department/University shall make internal assessment on that particular paper and submit the same to the parent Department for consideration.. However, no student shall be allowed to attend other institutions on that ground for more than one paper of the Course.

- (e) There shall be an End-Semester Examination for all the theory papers within the Course Work period (of Six months). The University Controller of Examinations shall conduct the End-Semester Examination as per examination procedure and combining with the Internal Assessment marks shall declare result within the period of the Semester. There shall be no backlog system in this examination.

10. **Duration of the Course:**

The minimum duration of the course is Three Years and maximum Six.

N.B. For admission in Ph.D. Programmes, new guidelines of UGC will be followed.

Reservation of Seats:

There shall be provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC/TGL/Category for differently able Persons for admission as follows :

- (a) As per Assam State Government rules
- (b) The University shall also follow its own reservation rules as and when necessary
- (c) Seats lying vacant against reservation shall be filled up by the University from the merit list of the candidates or on the basis of first come first chance basis

Quota Seats for Co-curricular activities such as Cultural, Sports, NCC/NSS will be allotted to the applicant subject to the clearance from the board constituted by the University authority.

Cancellation of Admission:

- (a) Admission of a student shall be considered null and void if the student remains absent continuously for fifteen days from the date of the starting of the classes
- (b) Admission shall also be treated as cancelled if the student or his/her guardian informs the University about their decision to discontinue or make the admission null and void. In such cases, however, no admission fee shall be refunded to the student.

EXAMINATION PROCEDURE:

(See University Regulations for Post Graduate Academic Programmes, Clause-7.00)

Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester. For the purpose of uniformity, particularly for interdepartmental transfer of credits, there shall be a uniform procedure of examination to be adopted by all departments/ centres. The Examination of all courses shall have two parts-

- a) In-Semester Assessment
- b) End Semester Examinations

There shall be at least two In-Semester assessments and one End-Semester examination in each course during every semester. The result of the In-Semester assessment shall be notified by the concerned course teacher(s) within seven days of the examination. **40% of the total marks** of each course shall be allotted for In-Semester evaluations.

In In-Semester assessments, two sessional tests shall be conducted for each course, which shall carry 50% of the total marks allotted for In-Semester assessment. Students must attend the two In-Semester examinations, failing which they will not be entitled to appear for the End-Semester examination.

For the remaining 50% of the total marks allotted for In-Semester assessment, the distribution of weightage shall be as below:

- a) Home Assignment : 10% (10 marks)
- b) Seminar presentation : 10% (10 marks)

All these components of assessments shall be mandatory. The students are to be informed in advance about the nature of assessment.

Ordinarily, a student cannot repeat In-Semester assessments. However, the Course Teacher may arrange In-Semester assessments beyond the regular schedule under special circumstances as deemed valid by himself/herself. The In-Semester assessment must be completed before the End-Semester examinations.

There shall be one End-Semester examination carrying 60% Marks in each course covering the entire syllabus of the course. The End semester examination is normally a written examination, or laboratory-based examination, or Project Work/Dissertation.

The mode of End-Semester examination and evaluation of the Course shall be specified in the Course Structure.

End-Semester Practical examinations shall normally be held before the theory examinations.

The mode of the conduct and evaluation of the End-Semester examinations of the theory courses shall be partially external as below:

- a) The question papers of at least 50% of the theory courses shall be set by external experts unless otherwise necessary considered as such by the Vice-Chancellor.
- b) The question papers shall be moderated by the Board of Moderators appointed by the Controller of Examinations for that purpose.
- c) Answer scripts of at least 50% of the theory courses shall be evaluated by the examiners other than the course teachers appointed by the Departmental CBCS Board with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.

The mode of the conduct of the End-Semester examinations of the practical/ dissertation courses shall be partially external as below:

- a) The end-semester examinations of all practical/ dissertation courses shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the internal examiner (the concerned course teacher) and an external examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor. The external examiner may be from in and outside of the Department concerned; or from outside the University, if need be.

The End-Semester examination schedule shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations in consultation with the Deans of the Schools of Studies. The date and schedule shall be notified at least fifteen days in advance.

Attendance Requirement

No student shall be allowed to sit in the End-Semester Examination unless he/has attained a minimum of **75% attendance** in their respective courses. A relaxation up to 5% in the attendance requirement be granted strictly on medical grounds. To qualify for this relaxation students must produce a valid medical certificate from a competent authority

RESULT SYSTEMS:

(See University Regulations for Post Graduate Academic Programmes, Clause-8.00)

A candidate shall be declared as successfully completed (passed) a course if he/ she secures at least **'P' grade** in the 10 point scale (as shown **below**) combining both the In-Semester and End Semester examination performance.

A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end semester examinations up to the final Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next semester with the failed course(s) as 'carry over' course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the 'carry over' course(s) in the next regular End-Semester examinations of those courses.

If a candidate clears the final semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the final semester examination of that candidate shall be kept withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.

A student must clear all his/her semester examinations within the stipulated duration shown as below irrespective of number of chances to appear in an end semester examination:

1 (one) Semester (Certificate)	2 (Two) Years
2 (two) Semesters (PG Diploma)	3 (Three) years*
4 (four) Semesters (PG Degree)	5 (five) years

EVALUATION SYSTEMS:

(See University Regulations for Post Graduate Academic Programmes, Clause-9.00)

- (a) The Course Teacher shall evaluate the answer scripts and submit the marks as well as letter grades to the Chairperson of the Departmental/ Centre CBCS Board.

In the case of the evaluation of the answer script by an external examiner, the Controller of Examinations shall take necessary step to finalize the Marks and the Letter Grade of such students through the Departmental CBCS Board.

The Departmental/Centre CBCS Board shall finalize the results of each examination/semester and notify the same before sending to the Controller of Examinations for preparation of Grade sheet and declaration of results.

- (b) In case of the distribution of marks for periodical presentation, dissertation and viva-voce shall be decided by the Course Teacher/Supervisor as per recommendation of the Board of Studies and duly approved by the statutory Bodies of the University.
- (c) Project report/ Dissertation shall be evaluated jointly by the supervisor and another examiner within the Department/ University or from outside the University appointed by the Controller of Examinations as recommended by the course teacher through the Chairperson of the Departmental CBCS Board. The modalities and timing of presentation, interview etc. shall be decided by the concerned Departmental/Centre CBCS Board.

- (d) Before declaring the results of the End-Semester examinations, the Controller of Examinations shall convene a meeting of the University CBCS Board to scrutinize the results of both In-Semester and End-Semester examinations. The Board may seek clarification or call for answer scripts if it feels necessary from the course teacher(s) concerned in the matters of over marking or under marking during examination(s).
- (e) The University CBCS Board shall recommend the results for declaration of results by the Controller of Examinations.
- (f) The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results finally and issue Grade-sheets.
- (g) The first rank holder of a programme may be decided on the basis of Overall Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of the core and elective courses considered for calculation of CGPA.

GRADING SYSTEMS:

(See University Regulations for Post Graduate Academic Programmes, Clause-10.00)

- (a) The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the students.
- (b) A candidate shall have to secure at least 'P' grade to pass a course taking both In and End-Semester marks together.
- (c) The marks of In-Semester examinations obtained shall be carried over for evaluating the grade of a course.
- (d) The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

A+	Excellent	9 (Marks securing 85%-95%*)
A	Very Good	8(Marks securing 75% -85%)

P	Pass	4 (Marks securing 45% -50%)
F	Fail	0(Marks securing below 45%)

Note: *Exclusive class interval technique is used here. For example, the class interval 55-65 includes candidates scoring percentage of marks starting from 55 upto any percentage **less than 65**.

- (e) The letter grade 'B+' and above shall be considered as First Class and letter grade 'B' shall be considered as Second Class with minimum of 55% marks.
- (f) A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than F (Failed) or 'Abs' (Absent/ Incomplete).
- (g) If a candidate secures 'F' grade in a Course, he/she shall have to reappear in the Course in the next legitimate chance.

- (h) If a student secures **F** grade in Project Work/ Dissertation/ assignment etc., he/she shall have to re-submit it after necessary revisions as suggested by the examiners/Course Teacher within 45 days after the declaration of the results.
- (i) **'Abs'** grade shall be awarded to a student on the following conditions-
- (i) If a student fails to appear in any Course(s) in an end semester examination,
 - (ii) If a student fails to submit the project report/dissertation or assignment of an End-Semester examination, and
 - (iii) If a student does not have required amount of attendance
- (j) The list of candidates awarded **'Abs'** shall be notified by the Head of the Department on recommendation of the Course Teachers and the copies of the notification shall be sent to the Controller of Examinations for necessary action.
- (k) A candidate may apply for improving marks in maximum two papers of the end-semester examination in each semester. Such betterment examinations shall be held within 45 days after the declaration of results. There shall be no provision for betterment examination in case of Practical/ Project work/ dissertation/ or assignments works as well as for the In-Semester Examinations
- (l) Students appearing in the Betterment Examination for the improvement of the Final result shall not be considered for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction; ***but shall be considered for modification of his/her Grade.***
- (m) Students shall have to pay prescribed fee to appear in the Betterment examinations' fixed by the University from time to time.
- (n) The overall performance of a student in a semester and his/her continuous performance from the second semester onwards shall be indicated by a Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). Hence, CGPA is the real indicator of a student's performance. It shall be calculated by the formula given below:

$$\text{SGPA} = (\sum C_i G_i) / (\sum C_i)$$

$$\text{CGPA} = (\sum \sum C_{ni} G_{ni}) / (\sum \sum C_{ni})$$

Where,

- C_i - number of credits for the i^{th} course,
- G_i - grade point obtained in the i^{th} course,
- C_{ni} - number of credits of the i^{th} course of the n^{th} semester,
- G_{ni} - grade points of the i^{th} course of the n^{th} semester

*SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported to the Grade Sheet and Transcript.

(o) **Conversion Formula**

Ordinarily, the CGPA earned by a student may be converted to percentage of Marks by following the formula mentioned as below:

$$\text{CGPA} \times 10 = \text{Percentage of Marks}$$

(p) Grade sheet:

The Grade Card issued at the end of the semester to each student will contain the following:

- (a) The performance in each course indicated by the letter Grade
- (b) The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and
- (c) The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).
- (d) The Conversion Formula

(q) TRANSCRIPT

The University may issue consolidated Transcript on request to Controller of Examinations which shall contain Letter grades, grade points and SGPA and CGPA mentioning the Course Titles in details, medium of instruction and programme duration.

MAKE-UP EXAMINATIONS/STUDENTS REDRESSAL:

(See University Regulations for Post Graduate Academic Programmes, Clause-11.00)

- (a) There shall one Make-Up examination for each Semester after 45 days from the declaration of the results
- (b) A candidate may apply to the Departmental/Centre CBCS Board for scrutiny/revision of the grades awarded in any of the Courses within one week on payment of a prescribed fee fixed by the University from time to time after notification of results by the concerned Departments/ Centres.

Provided that revision should be done before the document reaches the Controller of Examinations.

- (c) The Departmental/Centre CBCS Board may have the answer scripts of the aggrieved candidates re-examined by the course teacher, or by another teacher having expertise in the stream, if the appeal of the candidate(s) is found to be genuine.

An aggrieved candidate may be allowed to have a look on his/her answer script(s) by the Departmental/Centre CBCS Board, if the appeal of the candidate(s) is found to be genuine.

REMOVAL OF DIFFICULTIES:

If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of these regulations, the Vice Chancellor may, by order, make such provisions not consistent with the Act, the Statutes, Ordinances, or other Regulations, as appear to be necessary or expedient to remove the difficulty.

University Identity Card:

Identity card will be issued annually to all bonafide students at the time of admission. The old identity card must be surrendered at the end of each academic session for renewal. Failure to surrender the old identity card will result in the issuance of a new identity card. Students must carry their identity card while entering the University premises

University Rules & Regulations:

1. General Rules for maintaining Discipline:

- (a) Students admitted to the University must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the University authority. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory academic progress, irregular clearance of University and Hostel fees and dues, discourtesy to teachers and non-teaching staff, adoption of unfair means during examinations etc. are some of the offences which may make the student liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarships, non-issuance of University degrees, diplomas or certificates, expulsion from the hostel and from the University.
- (b) All forms of ragging inside the Hostel and University premises are strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken against anyone found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging.

2. Library Rules:

- (a) Books and other belongings should be kept in the property counter of the Library.
- (b) The Library is open from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on all weekdays except holidays.
- (c) If any book borrowed from the library is lost, torn or damaged in any form, the borrower must bear the cost of the book as per library rules.
- (d) Students are allowed to borrow up to 3 (Three) Books at a time.
- (e) A book can be kept for a maximum of 20 (Twenty) days from the date of issue. A fine of Rs. 2/- per day will be charged for every day the book is delayed beyond the due date. If a student does not return the book within one month from the date of issue, the Library Committee will take disciplinary action.

Introduction of NEP-2020 in FYUGP:

The University is set to introduce the National Education Policy (NEP)-2020 in the Four-Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) starting from the Academic Session 2025-26. To facilitate this transition, a NEP Implementation Committee has been formed.
